



Have you heard the news about the new bill? It's very exciting for the sixteen-year-olds in North Carolina. On June 19th, Governor Cooper signed House Bill 158. This allows teens to get a Level 2 Limited Provisional license without a road test. The license permits teens to drive between 5 am to 9 pm and have one minor inside their car. To get

this license, the driver will have to come with a parent or guardian and provide proof of liability insurance, submit a driving log with 60 hours of driving completed and get their picture taken. Once the DMV is allowed to have road tests again, the drivers with a Level 2 license will have to go back and take the road test to get a Level 3 license. This will help all of the teens with working parents and summer jobs get where they need to be.
